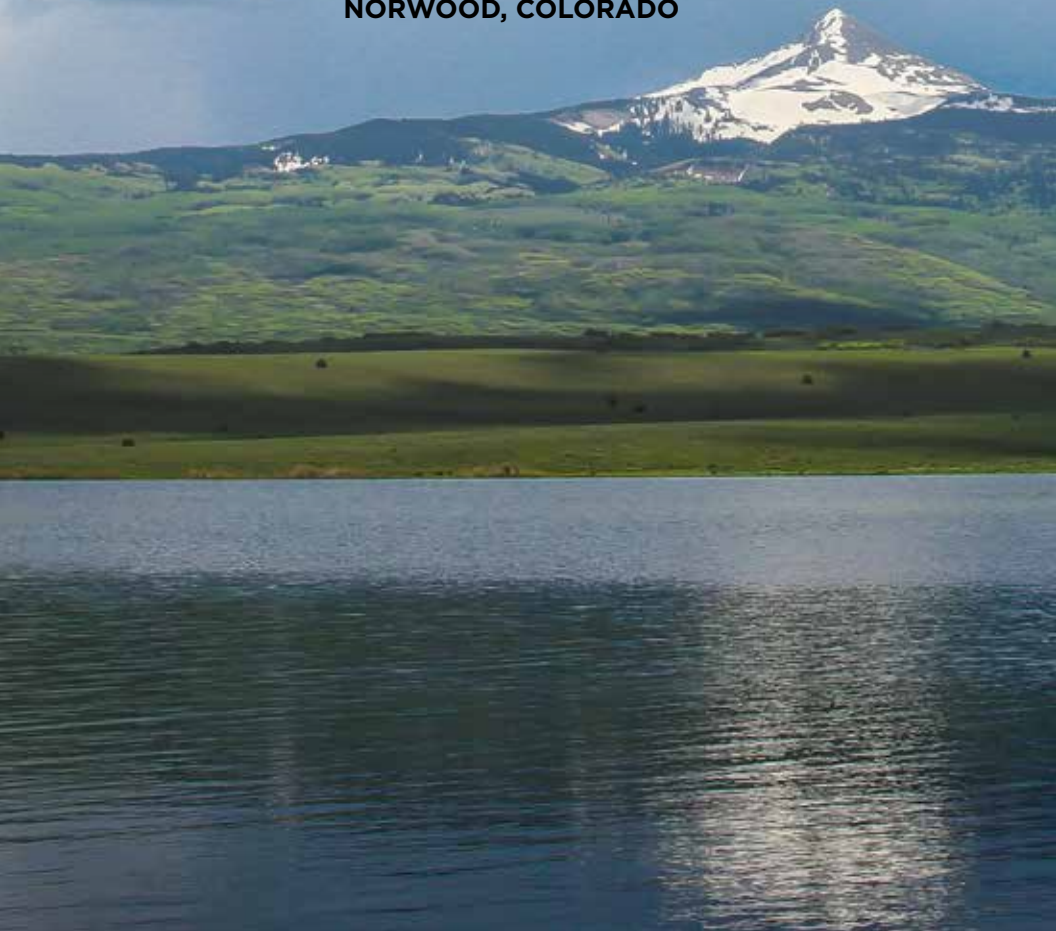

At the end of the week, after their animals have been judged and the champions have been awarded, the youth offer their projects for auction in the Junior Livestock Sale, which is open to the public. If you are free, please stop by and help make these kids feel good about their hard work. All are welcome and we look forward to a successful event!

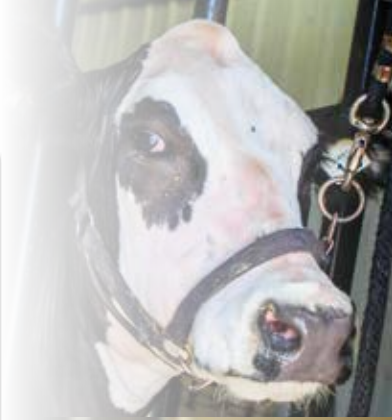
WHY IS THE JUNIOR LIVESTOCK SALE IMPORTANT?

The Junior Livestock Sale does more than help kids earn money for college. The program is founded in education, teaching youth about animal husbandry, leadership, public speaking, business and the agricultural industry. In order to sell their livestock, participants must meet stringent requirements and their animals must meet the high standards set forth by the Junior Livestock Sale. It is important to keep the Junior Livestock Sale thriving in order for kids to learn about the business aspect of the program and to capture future participant interest.



QUALITY IS WHAT YOU GET!

When you purchase an animal at the Junior Livestock Sale, you are purchasing a quality product that you will not find in a supermarket. Not only are you getting the highest quality meat, but you are also helping support the youth in your local community - it's a win, win! Junior Livestock animals are specially cared for. Participants must attend meat quality assurance classes and are educated about producing safe, healthy meat products.



AFTER PURCHASING...

Your options are open when you make a purchase at the Junior Livestock Sale. You may choose to take your animal home and put it out to pasture; you can make your own arrangements to have it processed; or you may choose to have your purchase sent to Homestead Meats or Kinikin Processing, both U.S.D.A Inspected, directly after the sale. Transportation to processing will be provided. Buyers are responsible for all processing and delivery costs. If you choose to have your animal sent for processing, it will be ready in approximately three weeks. The meat will be inspected and certified, cut, wrapped and processed to your specifications. Processing for poultry and rabbits must be arranged between the buyer and seller.



INTERESTED IN PARTICIPATING OR PURCHASING?

There are several ways for you to make a purchase at the Junior Livestock Sale to help out our fine 4-H youth! In order to bid, buyers are requested to register in advance by calling Regan Snyder at 970-201-8392 no later than July 12.

Animals are sold by the head and not by the pound. Buyers of Grand and Reserve Champion animals will receive special recognition throughout the year. Your purchase (above the market value, for the day) may be tax deductible.

ALTERNATIVE PURCHASE OPTIONS

ABSENTEE BUYER PROGRAM

Often buyers cannot be present at the Junior Livestock Sale, but they can still participate by having a representative buyer make their purchase. If you cannot be present at the sale, call the San Miguel Basin Fair, Josh Sinks, at 970-901-0128 or volunteer, Sherri Reeder at 970-428-3447, and the sales committee will make arrangements for you.

DONATE BACK

The buyer may purchase an animal and then immediately resale the animal, donating the proceeds from the second sale to a local 4-H club, FFA chapter or fair board. In this scenario the first buyer doesn't keep the meat. For example: original purchase price \$3,500 paid by the buyer, the animal is resold for \$2,000 and the proceeds are donated to a 4-H club.

BUY BACK

If a buyer is not interested in keeping the meat, the buyer may choose to resale the animal at the announced current fair market value the day of the sale. The buyer would be responsible for paying the difference between the original purchase price and the current market value. For example: original purchase price \$3,500 less the fair market value \$1,100 = \$2,400 amount owed by buyer.

SALE ADD ONS

Buyers can opt out of purchasing an animal and donate directly to a showman's project.

SPLIT PURCHASES

Not interested in a whole animal? Please contact Westen Enstrom at 970-258-0680 if you are interested in purchasing $\frac{1}{2}$ or $\frac{1}{4}$ of an animal. A member from our sales committee will be happy to assist you.

PAYMENT

Checks, cash and credit cards accepted terms of payment. A 3% convenience fee will be added to all credit card payments.

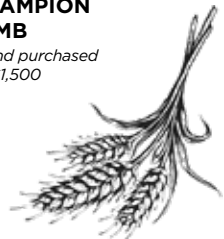
